Delegation: Ms. Jorge VanSlyke, CEO of Blanch River Health, accompanied by Chester Jobson, Chair of the Board of Directors at the Englehart Hospital.

- There is room to improve services.
- Doctor and other staff recruitments during COVID was difficult. The hospital had to be closed on one occasion as only 5 doctors remained on staff.
- All hospitals in the North are competing for doctors, nurses and other hospital staff.
- All hospitals are also facing financial shortages.
- In 2020 Englehart & Kirkland Lake hospitals joined. One CEO now works for both and is cost effective. Councillor McIntyre suggested that Temiskaming Hospital should be included and the three hospitals work together.
- Reeve Donaldson asked what municipalities can do regarding recruitment of medical staff.
- NOSOM has 6 students enrolled at present, but it is a very lengthy process. A partnership with NOSOM is in place, but there is no housing available. This is a huge problem.
- Councillor McIntyre asked if the hospital received Ontario funding during COVID.
- Ontario was good to the hospital during COVID. Most hospitals are now in financial trouble and must borrow from the Ministry of Health.
- Reeve Donaldson stated that the Para Services program does not allow employees to access patient records.
- There is a new medical records program being installed at a substantial cost to all users.
- Moving patients to/from medical facilities is very costly also. Chester Jobson added that TDSSAB took over ambulance services 5-6 years ago. The service is not working and has cost taxpayers millions to provide transportation services to patients.
- Councillor asked if volunteer drivers could be used?
- Volunteer drivers would be a challenge to organize and provide an efficient service.
- It is not all doom & gloom. Communities can volunteer in many ways. Please contact my office if you require additional information regarding the Blanche River Health Team.

Reeve Donaldson thanked Ms. VanSlyke and Mr. Jobson for attending the meeting and providing Council with information regarding Blanche River Health Team services.
